**Dr. Lory Schults Memorial lady Skipper Regatta**

**SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

**1 RULES**

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* and modified by these instructions and directions given at the Skipper's Meeting.

**2 ENTRIES**

Competitors may enter by delivering a completed entry form and paying the \$40.00 entry fee to before 10:00 AM on 10/3/2009.

**3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS**

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at the SJRYC.

**4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE**

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located near the Rhumbline Bar. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after flag AP is lowered.

**5 SCHEDULE and CLASS FLAG(S)**

A competitors' meeting will be held at the SJRYC, Saturday October 3 at 10:00 AM. The warning signal for the race will be 10:50. Class flags will not be used.

**6 RACING AREA**

The racing area will be inflatable buoys located near the St. Joe Piers and described at the Skipper's Meeting.

**7 COURSE and MARKS**

The course will be a triangle. The course will be designated at the Skipper's Meeting. All marks will be inflatables.

**8 STARTING AND FINISHING LINES; STARTING SYSTEM**

The starting and finishing lines will be between a power boat and a marker. The Sound Signal Starting System will be explained at the Skipper's Meeting.

**9 TIME LIMIT**

The time limit for the race will be announced at the Skipper's Meeting.

**10 PROTESTS**

Protests procedure will be announced at the Skipper's Meeting.

**11 SCORING**

One race constitutes a series.

**12 SPECIAL RULES**

A 3 second per mile credit will be adjusted to each boat's rating for each female sailor on board. This credit is available at a cost of \$5.00 per female.

This is a regatta to help raise money for Lory's Place and enjoy some Corinthian Spirit among sailors. When ever two boats come together there is invariably a race but the spirit of this event is one of comradery and good will.
